On the third day of our project we went to the school and we presented again one of our presentations, in the computer

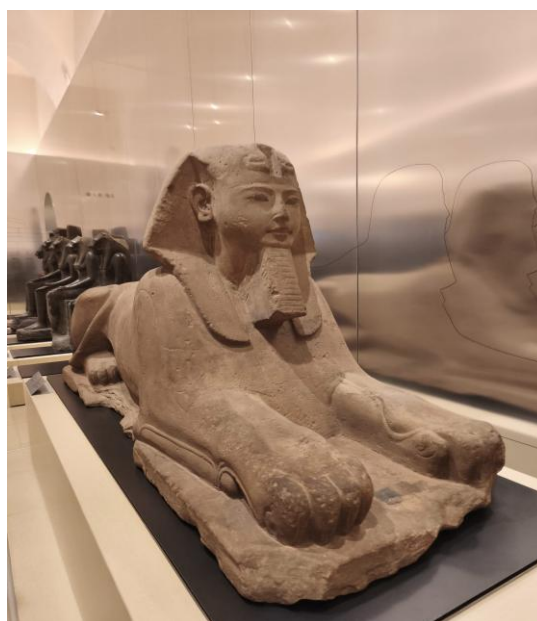
lab, and after that we went to the school's auditorium and continued the work on our project started the day before. After finishing them, each team presented their's.

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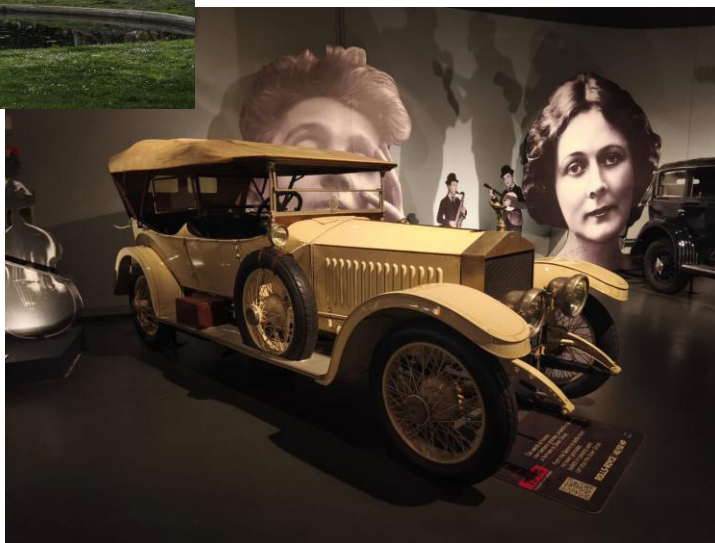
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they prepared for us a big table with some Italian foods and sodas.
