






Population: As of the 2021 census, the city has 116,033 inhabitants.

Ethnic Composition:
Approximately 54.8% are
Romanians, 41.8%
Hungarians, and 3.0% Roma.





Religious Affiliation: The population is predominantly Romanian Orthodox 48.67%, followed by Reformed 27.02% and Roman Catholic 12.67% communities.



1. Road Blocking Tradition ("Legarea Drumului")

During weddings, the friends and family of the bride and groom block the road leading to the wedding venue. To pass, the groom must complete funny challenges or pay a symbolic "ransom," usually in the form of drinks or sweets. This custom symbolizes the obstacles the couple must overcome in their marriage.





Similar to the bride's kidnapping, guests will sometimes steal the bride's shoes and demand a "ransom" in the form of a funny task from the groom or the best man. This custom symbolizes the importance of keeping an eye on the bride.



3. Easter Monday Sprinkling ("Stropitul Fetelor")

A tradition preserved mainly among the Hungarian communities, Easter Monday is marked by young men sprinkling perfume or water on young women. Originally done with water to promote health and beauty, today it is more common to use perfume. In return, the boys receive decorated eggs or sweets.







4. Fărșang (Farsang Carnival)


A Hungarian tradition similar to a carnival, celebrating the end of winter. People wear funny costumes, have parades, and make loud noises to ward off evil spirits.



In the Mureș County and Târgu Mureș, traditional cuisine reflects a blend of Romanian, Hungarian, and Saxon influences. Here are two popular dishes:

- Kürtőskalács (Chimney Cake) is a sweet, cylindrical pastry that is cooked over an open flame. It is prepared by wrapping dough around a wooden spit, roasted, and coated with sugar that caramelizes into a crispy, golden crust. It is traditionally served with walnut. This traditional Hungarian treat is a popular street food in the region.
- Lángos is a deep-fried flatbread, typically topped with sour cream, shredded cheese, and garlic. Occasionally it is served with jam or sugar for a sweet version. Originally from Hungary, it is widely enjoyed in the Mureş County as a savory snack, especially at festivals or fairs.





- Location in central Romania, in the historical region of Transylvania, with the Mureş River as its main waterway.
- Landscape A mix of mountains (the Călimani Mountains), hills, and plains, creating diverse natural scenery.
- Lakes and Rivers The Mureş River is the most important, along with natural attractions like Bear Lake in Sovata, the world's largest heliothermal lake, known for its therapeutic properties.







The Medieval Fortress of Târgu Mureș







One of Transylvania's best-preserved medieval fortifications, the 17th-century Târgu Mureș Fortress was built on an older stronghold and played a key defensive role.

Highlights:

- Massive stone walls with seven guildmaintained bastions
- 14th-century Reformed Church, the fortress's oldest building
- Exhibits on medieval artifacts and city history
- Cultural events, concerts, and historical reenactments
- Located in the city center, it remains a major tourist attraction and a symbol of Târgu Mureş' rich past.






VIBE Festival

It attracts thousands of young people, offering a mix of music, art, and creative activities.
